In 2010, under the auspices of Audubon Society of Rhode Island, Eric Shaw and July Lewis created a computer-based system that enabled volunteer Osprey monitors to log into a website and enter their observations from home. At the time it was a great system for tracking and collating the observations.

Fast forward ten years and the world of technology has seen many improvements and refinements. This summer it became clear that changes to the "backside" of the program had to be made. These improvements include the website forms and database used to track the observational information. Thankfully volunteer Jessica Skyleson showed up with both the patience and know-how to help make the changes. These improvements will be showcased at the training sessions and enacted for the 2020 season.

In addition to the data related improvements, we have been working to update the nest-related information such as location, structure, condition and directions. Gary Carlson (volunteer monitor and avid supporter of the program) has been instrumental in checking 'orphan' nests, updating the map with current data, offering strategic suggestions and serving as a resource to monitors.

The results of everyone's efforts over the past year are visible in the following changes to the program. Many thanks to Jessica and Gary for their hard work on behalf of the program.

- **Website (www.riosprey.info):** The website will remain the official link to the program. Monitors will continue to use the website to submit their observations and check on changes to the program. The website will still provide informational posts as well as links to general information about Osprey and the program.
- **Submitting Observation Information:** To enter information, monitors will continue to click on the 'Submit Data' tab on the website. After clicking on the tab, monitors will interact with a new Google-based form. The form has been refined after working with several monitors.
- **Data capture:** Using a Google-based system enables us to capture and organize more of the data submitted by monitors. This will greatly reduce the time spent behind-the-scenes reviewing every observation and creating graphs and tables to interpret the information captured by monitors.
- **Nest Site Map:** As the 2020 season unfolds you will see additional layers added to the map. These layers will display different information such as 'active' versus 'inactive' nest sites; monitored versus unmonitored sites, and updated nest information such as directions, nest status, nest structure, etc.
- Rhode Island Osprey Facebook Group: The Facebook group will remain open to current monitors. This site is inward facing and enables monitors to ask questions, post photos, offer suggestions and get to know each other through positive interactions in a safe, closed environment.
- Annual Rhode Island Osprey Report: The Report has grown quite a bit in both breadth and depth from 10 years ago. Making the above changes to the program will enable us to create the Report in a more timely manner while still providing data and comparative graphs and tables on nearly 250 nests in Rhode Island and Massachusetts.

#### Summary of 2019 Monitoring Results

#### **Rhode Island**

Throughout the 2019 Osprey breeding season Audubon Society Osprey monitors volunteered 1,016 hours observing 238 nests across 29 communities in Rhode Island.

An additional 48 nests were not monitored or not enough data was obtained to be conclusive. Four nests were classified as housekeeping and another 63 were classified as inactive. Of the 123 nests showing breeding activity, 118 were successful, producing a total of 212 fledglings.

#### Massachussetts:

A total of 10 nests were monitored in Seekonk and Swansea, Massachusetts. Of these 10 nests, one was classified as active and a second as unknown. The remaining 8 nests were successful, producing a total of 17 fledglings. For details regarding the breeding statistics of these nests refer to page 15.

#### **Glossary of Monitoring Terms**

**Insufficient Data**: Observations were inconclusive or no observations were made.

**Inactive**: No breeding-related behavior was observed

**Housekeeping:** Osprey pair observed at nest but breeding behavior not sustained.

Active Nests: Mating and/or incubation behavior ob-

Successful: Fledgling (s) observed. This category is a

subset of Active nests.




#### Osprey Nest Status

The following graph displays the breeding status of monitored Osprey nests across Rhode Island for the past nine years.



Graph 1: 2011-2019 Breeding Status of Osprey Nests in Rhode Island


The following graph compares the number of **active** (showing breeding activity) nests, **successful** nests and **fledglings** observed over the life of the monitoring program. Since the program is based on citizen science, one must be careful when making assumptions from the data. Several factors (number of monitors, time in the field and knowledge level) can impact the amount and accuracy of the data captured. That said, the longevity of the program, annual monitor training and consistent results indicate a pattern regarding the breeding success of the Osprey population in Rhode Island.




Graph #2: Osprey Observations 1977-2019

#### Osprey Fledglings

Tracking the number of fledglings produced from year to year is important when determining the health of the population. Studies have estimated that the breeding rate needed to balance adult mortality in New England is between 0.8 and 1.0 fledged young per active nest. In 2019 nests monitored in Rhode Island had 1.72 fledglings per active nest and 0.89 fledglings per all nests monitored.

### Volunteer Osprey Monitors in 2019

Throughout the 2019 breeding season (April-August), 83 volunteers reported on 193 nests in Rhode Island and 10 nests in Massachusetts. Monitors submitted over 3,000 observations and spent a total of 1,016 hours in the field. This season we had 18 people log in over 20 hours of observations, and 6 monitors logged in over 30 hours!

#### The Rhode Island Osprey Monitoring Program



The Osprey Monitoring Program was initiated in 1977 by the Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management (RIDEM). The goal was to observe the state Osprey population as it recovered from the effects of the pesticide DDT used from the 1940s through the 60s in Rhode Island.

Although DDT had been banned in 1972 the chemical continued to have a negative effect on the raptor population. In 1976 Osprey were designated as an endangered species. The first statewide count by RIDEM in 1977 yielded only 12 active nests. In the 1940s, before DDT, it was estimated that there were over a thousand nests between Boston and New York. DDT

had taken a major toll on the population of this fish-eating bird. The poison worked its way through the food chain, bio-accumulating in Osprey. The result was very weak eggshells which easily broke when incubated.

Since 1977 the Osprey Monitoring Program has been made possible by efforts of biologists, donors and volunteers who have observed all known Osprey nests in Rhode Island and carefully recorded data on the number of checks fledged and status of each nest.

In 2009 no results were available and in 2010 RIDEM passed management of the project to the Audubon Society of Rhode Island. Today, nearly 100 volunteer monitors continue to observe the state's Osprey population. By watching these sentinels, we learn more about wildlife and natural habitats as well as the level of human impact on these special places and unique species. It is a great testament to the dedication of Audubon's volunteer monitors that this citizen-science program continues to thrive.
