The Rhode Island Osprey Monitoring Project by Eric Walsh

Welcome to The Audubon Society of Rhode Island's annual Osprey report! Initiated by the Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management (RIDEM) in 1977, the Rhode Island Osprey Monitoring Project records the breeding success of Ospreys and documents the population's recovery from the effects of the pesticide DDT. With the cooperation of RIDEM, Audubon assumed management of the project in 2010.

2013 Project Highlights

In 2013, Osprey monitors reported 168 successfully fledged young slightly down from 2012. In our region, studies have estimated that the breeding rate needed to balance adult mortality is 0.8-1.0 fledged young per active nest. Rhode Island had 1.2 fledged young per active nest in 2013, slightly down from 1.4 in 2012, still indicating that population growth is likely to continue. We added 14 new nest sites for a total 209 sites monitored, which was the greatest number of sites we have moni-

tored.

You may notice the graphs include nesting results from 1977 and the number of Active nests in 1978 has been changed to 14 from the 12 listed in previous newsletters. These changes are a result of a review of the original nesting reports, which was part of my research on the Osprey population trends in RI. The complete monitoring results can be seen on page 2.

This year we kicked off the season with the second annual Osprey monitoring orientation. This is always an exciting event, because it marks the anticipated return of Ospreys and Spring.

The Osprey Monitoring Project has a website www.riosprey.info with all the information on the program, including the monitoring training manual, Google Earth map with nest sites, and the online data submission tool. In 2014, the website will include a convenient form for reporting new nest sites.

The Rhode Island Osprey monitoring program would not be possible without the volunteer monitors who provide detailed reports on each nest. We are very thankful to them for their dedication to Osprey conservation.

2013 Monitoring Results by Eric Walsh

In 2013, over 70 volunteers monitored 209 known nest sites. Of the 138 active nests, 96 produced at least one fledgling. A total of 168 young Ospreys successfully fledged. The RI breeding population produced an average of 1.75 fledglings per successful nest and 1.22 fledglings per active nest.

There were 50 inactive nest sites and 8 "housekeeping" nests. A "housekeeping nest" is a nest with Ospreys present but no observable incubation. Often these nests are built by sub-adult Ospreys.

The town with the greatest number of fledglings (27) was Barrington and Warren had the second greatest number of fledglings (24) recorded within its borders. However, South Kingstown had the greatest number of Active nest sites (17) and produced 20 fledglings.




Figure 1. The total number of active osprey nests since the RI Osprey Monitoring Project began.




Figure 2. The total number of successful nest sites documented each year since the RI Osprey Monitoring Project began.




Figure 3. The total number of fledged ospreys documented each year since the RI Osprey Monitoring Project began.
