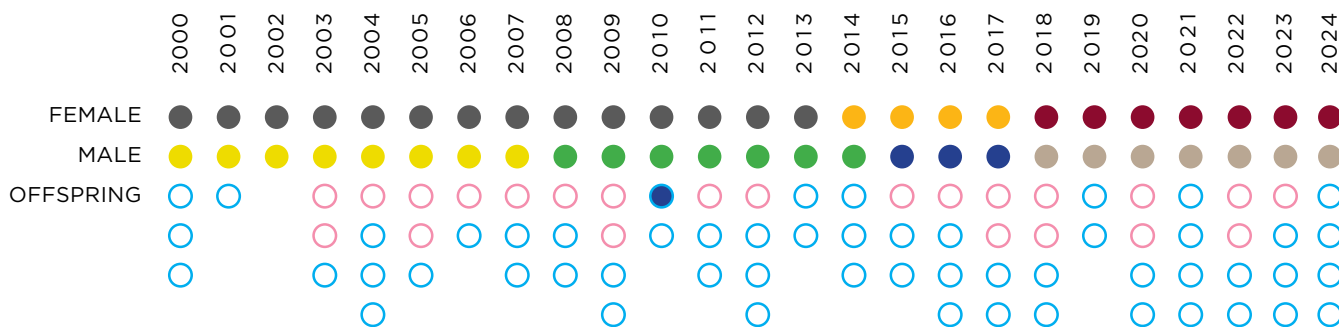


PEREGRINE FALCONS AT 111 WESTMINSTER STREET

- SHADOW**
Unbanded female. Origin unknown.
- U*/7**
Male hatched and banded in Boston, MA, 1997.
- 80/X**
Male hatched and banded in Boston, MA, 2007.
- 63/AE**
Female hatched and banded in Lowell, MA, 2010.
- 25/AB**
Male hatched and banded in Providence, RI, 2010. Returned in 2015, displaced his father and mated with his “step-mother”.
- UNBANDED FEMALE**
Origin and age unknown. Arrived in Providence in 2018. Uncertain if same bird through 2024.
- UNBANDED MALE**
Origin and age unknown. Arrived in Providence in 2018. Uncertain if same bird through 2024.

The highest perch in Providence, 111 Westminster Street has an unrivaled 360° view. Each year, the resident pair of falcons fight to defend the nest box on the building from interlopers.

Since 2018, the box is occupied by unbanded birds and it may be difficult to know if they are displaced by other unbanded birds. The good news is that the increasing number of unbanded Peregrine Falcons is evidence that the species is rebounding in the wild and there are many successful nests unknown or unreachable to ornithologists.
