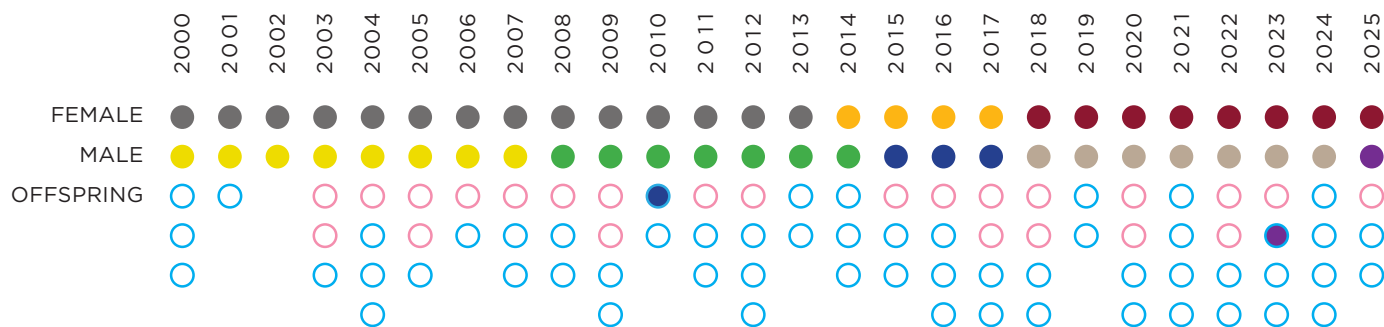


# PEREGRINE FALCONS AT 111 WESTMINSTER STREET

in Lowell, MA, 2010.



## 25/AB

Male hatched and banded in Providence, RI, 2010. Returned in 2015,  
displaced his father and mated with his “step-mother”.



## UNBANDED FEMALE

Origin and age unknown. First seen in Providence in 2018.  
Questionable if same bird through 2025 because 88/BU (2025)  
is unlikely to have mated with his own mother.



## UNBANDED MALE

Origin and age unknown. First seen in Providence in 2018.  
Uncertain if same bird through 2024.



## 88/BU

Male hatched and banded in Providence, RI, 2023.  
Returned in 2025.

111 Westminster Street is the highest perch in Providence with an unrivaled 360° view. Each year, the resident pair of falcons fight to defend the nest box on the building from interlopers.

The increasing number of unbanded Peregrine Falcons is evidence that the species is rebounding in the wild and there are many successful nests unknown or unreachable to ornithologists.
